Teaching Narrative

The central goals of my teaching are to assist and inspire a wide spectrum of students in developing their own independent research agendas in health care organizations, services and policy. I reach out to students in a wide range of disciplines, degree programs and academic institutions through a combination of teaching formal courses, guest lecturing and one-on-one mentoring. This allows me to stay engaged with a diversity of students, to continuously learn from them and improve my teaching skills, and to maintain broad institutional ties that allow me to broker on behalf of my students' efforts to achieve their career aspirations.

My service as a course instructor began in 1989 when I started regularly lecturing at UC Berkeley University Extension. From the very start, I taught a wide range of students, in this case, students from many walks of life who were now seeking clinical licenses and continuing medical education credits. Subsequently, I taught undergraduate sociology in several different capacities at UCB, and served as a pre- and post-doctoral mentor for the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Training Grant to the UC Berkeley School of Public Health and Alcohol Research Group. Again, my students came from a range of disciplines in the social and clinical sciences.

Since coming to UCSF in 2003, I have continued in this vein through mentoring and teaching courses in the Philip R. Lee Institute for Health Policy Studies interdisciplinary fellowship program, along with helping to guide curriculum development as a member of the Institute's training committee. I regularly teach the program's core course in policy analysis, *The Culture and History of Health Policy*, which introduces students to key theories that are then applied to empirical case studies of key US health policies. I am also helping to bring a more explicit health policy perspective into the UCSF undergraduate medical curriculum by serving as a member of the cross-department team developing the *Health Systems and Leadership Pathway*, having also helped with this initiative's precursor, the *Health Policy Area of Content*. And throughout my time at UCSF, I have continued to reach out across disciplines and institutions by serving on UCB dissertation committees in public health and social welfare, by regularly guest lecturing in UCSF and UCB courses on health policy, organizations and survey methods, and by assisting with the development and teaching of UCB's undergraduate lecture course on medical sociology. Finally, I have found that one of the most effective teaching strategies is to fund and involve students in my extramurally-funded research projects. Not only has this allowed me to teach methods, grantsmanship and manuscript development using an "apprenticeship" model, but in a number of cases, this approach has allowed me to help my students succeed with their own first grant applications to become independent Principle Investigators.

RESEARCH PROGRAM

My research program focuses on the social dimensions of health and illness, with an emphasis on the social and organizational contexts in which care is provided and on substantive health issues, such as addiction, that are heavily influenced by the social environment. My published studies draw upon a range of social science and epidemiological methods, including multi-wave longitudinal studies, trends and multi-level analyses, as well as historical and ethnographic methods. A hallmark of my research is the use of quantitative approaches to study patient populations in combination with qualitative and archival research on the health care policies and organizations that provide the patients' care.

My published work has contributed to several substantive areas including the policy and organization of health care, access to care, health inequality and the cultural and socioeconomic contexts in which disease processes unfold. One portion of my research agenda has utilized historical-archival methods to study the foundations of the current health care market in America in ways that provide a new perspective on theories of organizational and institutional change. Other projects focus on the organization and financing of addiction services, on national analyses of treatment access and disparities in care, and more recently, studies of the current push toward quality improvement in the management of addiction treatment. Since 1999, I have also served as Principal Investigator for the Welfare Client Longitudinal Study (WCLS) funded through a series of grants by the National Institutes on Health (NIH) and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF). The WCLS links multi-wave survey data on the health status and service use of welfare recipients with qualitative data on the changing organizations that serve them. The WCLS team has included up to 22 scientific staff who have collectively produced over 75 scientific presentations and publications, 3 UC Berkeley dissertations, and 6 NIH- and RWJF-funded spin-off studies focusing on homelessness, poverty and violence, child welfare, and the intergovernmental dynamics of welfare policies affecting health.

A related goal of my current research program is to better understand and address the institutional constraints and opportunities for reducing health inequality at the level of international policy regimes, nation states and global institutions. As a collaborator on the World Health Organization (WHO) and NIH Joint Project on Diagnosis and Classification of Mental Disorders, I began my international work by studying the problems of cross-cultural applicability in global efforts to establish standard diagnostic criteria for addictive disorders for use in all WHO member nations via the *International Classification of Diseases, Version 10 (ICD-10)* and the *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of the American Psychiatric Association, Version IV*. My current efforts in this area include participating in the Priority Public Health Conditions Knowledge Network (PPHC-KN) of the UN/WHO Commission on the Social Determinants of Health. Under the direction of Sir Michael Marmot, the PPHC-KN seeks to develop novel, pragmatic, evidence-based strategies for creating better social conditions for health worldwide in pursuit of the UN-chartered *Millennium Development Goals*. As a member of the Alcohol Programme Node, my interest is in bringing together what we already know from science to develop new policy interventions for reducing the alcohol-attributable global burden of disease, particularly in developing societies and in the poor and marginalized segments of developed ones.
